I cannot believe it is March already. Our Northern quests will be heading home soon. I wish you all safe travels and look forward to seeing you in the fall. As I am sure everyone knows, our bartenders are paid employees of our Post. We are required by a Florida State Law enacted on 1 January 2015 (and of which we were informed on 28 January) to pay them \$5.03 an hour in direct wages. Their tips contribute to their earnings but if those earnings do not average out to \$8.05, the new legal minimum wage, the employer (The Post) must make up the difference. This is non-negotiable. I have heard people say they are not tipping the bartenders because they are now paid employees. This is a close-minded, unfair point of view. Tips are part of their wage. If you go to a restaurant you tip servers 15% or more for good service and courtesy, why would you consider our bartenders any less deserving of tips? Those servers earn the same minimum direct wage, \$5.03, as our bartenders. Our bartenders provide us great service and courtesy and are very loyal to us. They rarely turn down request to work at events and the ones that don't provide what we expect of our employees are asked to depart. PLEASE, please be sure to tip them and show your appreciation for the service they provide. We have a majority vote to pay them \$5.05. Enough Said. Speaking of our Canteen, it will close April 19th for annual spring-cleaning. Please put it on your calendar and come out and give us a hand. We do this once a year to clean the places that don't normally get done. We will have a number of tasks to do that day, but we need people to get this done. Even if you can only come for a couple hours, every little bit helps. The same goes for any event you see on the calendar. If you just pick one event a month to pitch in and help at, we'd appreciate your assistance. For instance, one comrade always washes dishes for the LAVFW at their Friday Fish Fry. Nasty but necessary job. Kitty Dye always feeds him a big chicken dinner. Everybody's happy and the dishes, pots and pans are done for the next event.



VFW RELEASES INITIAL REPORT ON THE VETERANS CHOICE PROGRAM

VFW RECOMMENDATIONS WOULD IMPROVE DELIVERY OF HEALTH CARE OPTIONS FOR VETERANS

WASHINGTON, D.C 3 March 2015 — The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. will deliver to Congress this week its initial report on the implementation of the new Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans Choice Program. The report is based on a survey of more than 2,500 VFW members over the first three months of the Veterans Choice Program, which VA launched on November 5, 2014.

"It is important that veterans have the opportunity to make informed health care decisions that best fit their own individual circumstances," said VFW National Commander John W. Stroud, who's in Washington along with more than 500 VFW advocates to deliver the report to every member of Congress as part of this week's VFW National Legislative Conference. "The Veterans Choice Program is an ambitious initiative that is supposed to offer more options to veterans who need it, which is why the VFW has an obligation to keep our pulse on the veterans' community to ensure the program works."

The VFW survey identified problems among many veterans who believed they were eligible for the Choice Program due to their geographic distance from a VA facility. For those who have waited 30 or more days for an appointment, the VFW also identified communication and training problems that may have precluded veterans from being properly informed of their non-VA care options.

The VFW is now working closely with VA and the third party administrators responsible for the implementation of the Choice Program.

The VFW's report includes six specific recommendations to improve the delivery of health care options for veterans, as well as a detailed analysis of participation, wait-time standards, geographic eligibility, and non-VA care issues that must be addressed to ensure this important program succeeds in increasing access to health care for America's veterans. In an ongoing effort to hold the VA accountable for the proper implementation of this program, and to provide direct customer feedback, the VFW has now launched a second Veterans Choice Program survey, which is available via www.vfw.org/VAWatch.

AWARDS AND CITATIONS

Silver Star; Purple Heart; Medal of Honor Awarded for actions during the Vietnam War







The President of the United States of America, in the name of Congress, takes pride in presenting the Medal of Honor (Posthumously) to Staff Sergeant Clifford Chester Sims (ASN: 14780953), United States Army, for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a squad leader with Company D, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 501st Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division, in action against enemy aggressor forces at Hue, Republic of Vietnam, on 21 February 1968. Company D was assaulting a heavily fortified enemy position concealed within a dense wooded area when it encountered strong enemy defensive fire. Once within the wood line, Staff Sergeant Sims led his squad in a furious attack against an enemy force which had pinned down the 1st Platoon and threatened to overrun it. His skillful leadership provided the platoon with freedom of movement and enabled it to regain the initiative. Staff Sergeant Sims was then ordered to move his squad to a position where he could provide covering fire for the company command group and to link up with the 3d Platoon, which was under heavy enemy pressure. After moving no more than 30 meters Staff Sergeant Sims noticed that a brick structure in which ammunition was stocked was on fire. Realizing the danger, Staff Sergeant Sims took immediate action to move his squad from this position. Though in the process of leaving the area two members of his squad were injured by the subsequent explosion of the ammunition, Staff Sergeant Sims' prompt actions undoubtedly prevented more serious casualties from occurring. While continuing through the dense woods amidst heavy enemy fire, Staff Sergeant Sims and his squad were approaching a bunker when they heard the unmistakable noise of a concealed booby trap being triggered immediately to their front. Staff Sergeant Sims warned his comrades of the danger and unhesitatingly hurled himself upon the device as it exploded, taking the full impact of the blast. In so protecting his fellow soldiers, he willingly sacrificed his life. Staff Sergeant Sims' extraordinary heroism at the cost of his life is in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself and the United States Army.
