
### VFW Post 10555 Quartermaster's Two Cents Rob Smith (robfsmith127@gmail.com)

#### Thank You for Your Support of the Fisher House of the Emerald Coast

The Fisher House Foundation © 2010 is a unique private-public partnership that supports America's military in their time of need. The program recognizes the special sacrifices of our men and women in uniform and the hardships of military service by meeting a humanitarian need beyond that normally provided by the Departments of Defense and Veterans Affairs.

Because members of the military and their families are stationed worldwide and must often travel great distances for specialized medical care, Fisher House Foundation donates "comfort homes," built on the grounds of major military and VA medical centers. These homes enable family members to be close to a loved one at the most stressful times - during the hospitalization for an unexpected illness, disease, or injury.

There is at least one Fisher House at every major military medical center to assist families in need and to ensure that they are provided with the comforts of home in a supportive environment. Annually, the Fisher House program serves more than 12,000 families, and have made available over 3,000,000 days of lodging to family members since the program originated in 1990. By law, there is no charge for any family to stay at a Fisher House operated by the Department of Veterans Affairs; and Fisher House Foundation uses donations to reimburse the individual Fisher Houses operated by the Army, Navy, and Air Force. No family pays to stay at any Fisher House!

Something perhaps you ought'a know. note to say thank you for your posts' joining the program that saves the pull-tab tops from the aluminum cans for Fisher House. In the past week the tabs were turned in (recycled if you will) at a metal collector and the Triple Nickel and Legion Post 402, along with nine other Veteran Service Organizations, clubs, can proudly say "We contribute!" Contribute? Recycled? Fisher House? - wait a minute, what's going on? Quite some time ago along comes a USAF Vet who began this adventure, realizing that once a Fisher House is opened, released to house families, and though they continue to be under the Fisher House wing, they are cut loose from the Fisher House Foundation, Washington, D.C., and greatly depend thereafter on it's wit, donations, own projects, & local community for funds to carry on. That is where we come in - the collection of the aluminum. And no, we're not making very much money, and yes, the cans actually pay better, but other organizations are promised those, plus so much easier handling the tabs. Having said that, those collected in the past 4-month period totaled 160 lbs; can you even imagine what 160 lbs of aluminum pull-tabs look like in the back of a pickup truck???

Our closest Fisher House opened on Eglin AFB in 2010, right behind its hospital operated by the 96<sup>th</sup> Medical Group, USAF. Upon notification that another small check was being mailed to them from the collectors over here, their thanks was - as always - heartfelt and ongoing. We've managed to start something here in Bay County, I wish we could interest the other six Veterans Service Organizations (VSOs) to join us, but - now think about it - wouldn't it be something if all the VSOs in Florida were saving these for their Fisher House?

So we are in good company as Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10555 saves aluminum pull tabs alongside Posts 2185 (Panama City) & 10069 (not in Bay County but supportive nonetheless) American Legion Post 402 and 392 (Lynn Haven); AmVets 2298, 231, & 47, Disabled American Veterans Chapter 17, Bay County Veterans Council, and so many other wonderful folk who simply save at home yet know when to bring them. I salute all whom contribute. *Let Us Continue!*
